

In accordance with the Township's request, Hatch Mott MacDonald (HMM) is pleased to provide herewith our formal proposal for Professional Engineering Services for the renovations to the three existing tennis and two basketball courts located in Freeman Douglass Jr. Memorial Park.

It is our understanding that the scope of renovations includes the following:

- Replacement of (3) tennis courts and (2) basketball courts, including replacement of asphalt pavement and base stone, color coating, and striping. We understand the Township is interested in modifying the configuration if possible to include five (5) tennis courts and one (1) basketball court;
- Removal and replacement of existing tennis and basketball court furnishings, including tennis nets and posts, basketball backstops (posts, backboard, rims);
- Grading improvements to the courts to improve the existing poor drainage conditions;
- Replacement of the existing perimeter chain link fencing; and
- We understand that the Township plans to demo the existing courts themselves (removal and disposal of existing asphalt/base stone, and perimeter fencing) and therefore have not included the design services associated with demolition in this proposal beyond making the bidders aware of the condition the Township will leave the courts in prior to their mobilization.

To address the above improvements, HMM's scope of work includes the following five (5) tasks:



Task 1

Topographic Survey

HMM will prepare a topographic survey of the existing three (3) tennis courts and two (2) basketball courts limited to the area within the perimeter retaining wall on three sides and the sidewalk and curb on the parking lot side of the courts (hereafter known as the "Construction Area"). The map will include the various site features within this area including top of walls, curbs, sidewalk elevations, court surface elevations, nets, posts, and basketball goals.

The topographical mapping will form the basis of the layout of site improvements that will be required for the court renovations. The topographic map will be provided to the Township in an electronic format on AutoCAD Version 2013 along with signed prints of the topographic survey map. Horizontal and vertical survey control will be established and all survey data will be based upon NJ State Plane Coordinates (NAD 83 & NGVD 88), with reference benchmarks located in the field and documented on the plans. The topographic survey will also indicate the geotechnical boring locations described in Task 2 of this proposal.

We propose to complete the scope of work outlined above (**Task 1**) for the lump sum amount of **\$3,075**.

Task 2

Limited Geotechnical Investigations

Due to substantial cracking throughout portions of the existing tennis and basketball courts we recommend that a limited geotechnical investigation be performed to evaluate the subgrade conditions that currently exist under the courts. HMM's geotechnical scope of work consists of performing seven 15-foot deep soil borings throughout the Construction Area. One boring within each tennis court footprint will be advanced in a staggered fashion between courts, and two borings (one at each end) will be advanced within the basketball court footprint. The borings will be completed to evaluate any constructability concerns related to native subbase material, and requirements for compaction and proof-rolling of court subbase.

The scope includes the geotechnical borings, geotechnical field observation, and geotechnical report. HMM will coordinate with the driller (subcontractor), geotechnical laboratory, and client staff for scheduling and site access. The geotechnical report will include soil properties, groundwater, bearing/settlement/design parameters for structural design, and construction recommendations. The scope includes retaining a licensed drilling subcontractor, soils lab, as well as direct expenses. Each boring will be sampled continuously to target end depth. It is anticipated that, as the courts will be demolished, the site may be accessible by truck rig. Removal of any fencing is not anticipated as part of the scope and is assumed to be performed by the Township if required. The lump sum fee associated with this task assumes the drilling subcontractor is allowed 8 hours of uninterrupted work per workday. We estimate the program will be completed in one day.

This scope of work was completed in November 2015. A copy of the "Geotechnical Evaluation and Recommendation Report was hand-delivered to the Township on December 1, 2015.



Task 3

Design & Construction Documents

Task 3.1 -- Schematic Court Layout

HMM will utilize the topographic survey prepared under Task 1 as the basis for developing construction documents for the court renovations. Prior to preparing construction documents HMM will prepare a Schematic Court Layout Drawing to determine the court layout that will maximize the number of courts that will fit understanding that the Township is interested in fitting (5) tennis courts and (1) basketball court. Court layout and dimensions will be based upon the current standard dimensions/guidelines for tennis/ basketball courts. HMM will provide the schematic court layout to the Township for approval prior to proceeding with Construction Documents.

Task 3.2 – 90% Construction Documents

Upon receiving approval from the Township HMM will advance the Schematic Court Layout to 90% complete Construction Documents. Following the 90% Township Review, 100% complete construction documents (plans, specifications and cost estimate) will be prepared for public bidding purposes.

During this task HMM will finalize the site plan, grading changes to the courts and drainage improvements and design details. Complete specifications will be prepared for the project. The technical specifications will provide the contractor with the technical information required to construct the project. The specification language from the various disciplines of engineers will also be included into the technical section of the specifications. The specifications will follow the three (3) part Construction Specification Institute (CSI) format. HMM will also provide a copy of the geotechnical report (included as an appendix) within the contract documents.


Task 3.3 – 100% Construction Documents for Bidding

Upon completion of Township's review of the 90% submission, the HMM design team will incorporate comments and finalize the plans and specifications into 100% Contract Documents that will be of sufficient detail for competitive public bidding purposes.

The final contract documents will include, at a minimum, the following:

- Title Sheet
- Existing Conditions Plan
- Site and Grading Plan
- Detail Sheets
- Complete specifications (plus manufacturer's information for any special products proposed for the project) for bidding purposes.
- Geotechnical specifications for underlying court materials, compaction and testing requirements

The final project deliverables will include:



- Ten (10) sets of Contract Documents (Plans and Specifications) for public bidding purposes.
- Engineer's estimate of quantities and final cost estimate.
- Anticipated construction schedule.

We propose to complete the scope of work outlined above (Task 3) for the lump sum amount of \$12,670.

Task 4

Bid & Award Phase Services

HMM will provide the following services under Task 4:

- HMM will assist the Township with the bidding process. It is assumed that the Township will advertise the notice to bid;
- Respond to potential questions and requests for additional information from Contractors bidding on the project;
- Prepare any addenda or clarification memos resulting from bidders' inquiries during the bidding phase. Report to the Township when clarifications and interpretations of the Contract Documents are needed and transmit to the Township clarifications and interpretations to be issued to prospective bidders;
- Attend the bid opening;
- Furnish a Bid Report that summarizes the information in the bids received and provide recommendations for the award of the Contract based upon input received from references and review of bid forms. It is assumed the Township will contact Contractors' references and perform a legal review of the bidders documents -- bonds, technical completeness, compliance with public bidding laws, etc.);
- Following Bid and Award HMM will revise the contract bid documents (plans, contract documents and specifications) to incorporate all clarifications and addendum details issued during the bidding process.
- Prepare Pre-Construction meeting agenda, attend pre-construction meeting and prepare meeting minutes;

HMM's proposal is based upon one round of bidding. If for any reason, other than an error on the part of HMM, additional round(s) of bidding are required, those additional services will be considered beyond our original scope of services.

We propose to complete the scope of work outlined above (Task 4) for the lump sum amount of \$4,825.



Task 5	Construction Inspection Services
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HMM will provide the following services under Task 5:

- Perform periodic inspection of the construction to be performed by the Contractor. It is assumed that the contract period for this project will be **sixty (60) calendar days**. During this time period we recommend that HMM provide an inspector to perform construction observation of the Contractor’s activities for a minimum of **16 hours per week** for the duration of the contract. It is our understanding that the Township intends to utilize in-house staff to supplement construction observation as they deem necessary;
- Perform shop drawing review of construction materials to be submitted by Contractor;
- Prepare Contractor’s applications for payment (assuming two) and final punchlist;
- Prepare final punchlist; and
- Perform final inspection and project closeout services.

Based on the anticipated construction period and the assumptions identified above regarding limited construction observation, we anticipate a **budget of \$24,825** for Task 5 will be required for construction inspection services. Should the Township find that additional construction observation is warranted, HMM will provide that out-of-scope construction observation on a reimbursable basis as authorized by the Township.
