


GUIDE TO SINGLE STREAM RECYCLING



Paper
Plastic

Metal



- Newspapers with Inserts
- Office Paper
- Junk Mail
- Shredded Paper (in a clear plastic bag)
- Brown Paper Bags
- Magazines
- Telephone and Paperback Books
- Cardboard and CLEAN Pizza Boxes
- Gift, Shoe, Tissue and Powdered Detergent Boxes
- Dry Food Boxes (Cereal, Cracker, Pasta, etc.) (Remove all liner bags)
- Beer and Soda Carriers
- Non-Foil Wrapping Paper



#1 through #7 Plastic Bottles and Containers including:

- Food and Beverage Containers (Margarine Tubs, Microwave Trays, Yogurt Containers, etc.)
- Health, Beauty and Cleaning Product Containers
- Other Rigid Plastic Containers including: Buckets and Landscape Pots (5 gallons in size or less)



Food, Beverage and Aerosol Cans:

- Aluminum
- Steel (Tin) (5 gallons in size or less)

Food and Beverage Glass Containers including:

- Clear
- Green
- Brown Bottles, Jars and Jugs

DO NOT RECYCLE

- Food Contaminated Boxes
- Styrofoam Packaging
- Polystyrene Egg Cartons
- Wax-Coated Cardboard Boxes
- Window Glass
- Beverage Cups
- Paint Cans
- PVC Pipes
- Light Bulbs
- Plastic Bags
- Any items that contained chemical or hazardous products

Used Motor Oil, Oil Filters and Antifreeze	Bulky Mixed Rigid Plastics - larger than 5 gallons in size
Tires	White Goods
Batteries (Auto and Marine Acid Batteries)**	Freon Containing White Goods
Vegetative Recyclables (Leaves, Grass and Brush)	Wood Pallets
Propane Tanks	Scrap Metal
Plastic Film	

*Effective January 1, 2011, the New Jersey Electronic Waste Management Act, P.L. 2008 c. 130, prohibits the landfilling of these consumer electronics. Contact your municipality to ask about collection or a drop-off location.

**Small rechargeable batteries are recycled at retail drop off sites. For locations, visit www.call2recycle.org or call 877-723-1297. Dispose of single use alkaline batteries (AAA, AA, C, D, etc.) in the regular trash.

Call your municipality to ask about curbside collection or drop-off locations.

Do not dispose of needles in recycling.
