RESOLUTION #2024-336

Title: A RESOLUTION AUTHORIZING THE RENEWAL OF LIQUOR LICENSE #0505-31-024-001

WHEREAS, an application was made for renewal of Club Liquor License #0505-31-024-001, issued to and held by the Sunset Beach Sportsman's Club; and

WHEREAS, on April 18, 2024, the Township of Lower received written correspondence from the State of New Jersey Department of Environmental Protection ("NJDEP") formally objecting to the renewal of Club Liquor License #0505-31-024-001; and

WHEREAS, pursuant to the provisions of N.J.A.C. 13:2-2.7, a hearing was scheduled for Monday, June 17, 2024 at 5 p.m. at the Township Municipal Building located at 2600 Bayshore Road, Villas, New Jersey 08251 to consider the application to renew said Club Liquor License and the written objection received from the NJDEP; and

WHEREAS, on May 29, 2024, the Township of Lower received correspondence from the NJDEP reiterating its objection to the renewal of the referenced Club Liquor License, and further advising the Township that a decision had been rendered by the Cape May County Superior Court in Docket No. CPM-L-414-22 granting the NJDEP the "legal right to exclusive sole possession of the property upon which the Sunset Beach Sportsmen's Club sits and ordering the Club to vacate the property before November 11, 2024; and

WHEREAS, on June 4, 2024, the Township of Lower received correspondence from the Club's attorney, Christopher Gillin-Schwartz, Esquire, that the Club had filed an appeal of the Cape May County Superior Court's Decision and requested a stay of the effect of the Court's Order; and

WHEREAS, the June 17, 2024 was ultimately adjourned to the July 1, 2024 Township Council meeting due to delays in receiving a required tax clearance certificate which is a prerequisite to the renewal of a liquor license; and

WHEREAS, on June 24, 2024, correspondence was received from the New Jersey Division of Alcohol Beverage Control ("ABC") requesting that the Township of Lower abstain from renewing the Club's license until the ABC rendered a jurisdictional determination as to whether or not the Township was authorized to renew the Club Liquor License in question in light of the objections made by the NJDEP; and

WHEREAS, on September 19, 2024, the NJDEP sent correspondence to the ABC formally withdrawing its request for a jurisdictional determination indicating that it intended to wait for the resolution of the appeal pending before the New Jersey Superior Court – Appellate Division; and

WHEREAS, on October 1, 2024, in light of the NJDEP's withdrawal of its request for a jurisdictional determination from the ABC, counsel for the Sunset Beach Sportsmen's Club sent written correspondence to the Township requesting that the Township proceed with a hearing on the renewal of the Club Liquor License, and the Township proceeded to schedule same for its October 21, 2024 council meeting; and

WHEREAS, the Township Council of the Township of Lower received and considered all written submissions from the State of New Jersey Department of Environmental Protection prepared by David M Golden and various Deputy Attorney Generals, and received testimony and argument on behalf of the Sunset Beach Sportsman's Club; and

WHEREAS, at the conclusion of said hearing, the Township Council of the Township of Lower found that the application submitted by the Sunset Beach Sportsman's Club seeking to renew Club Liquor License #0505-31-024-001 should be granted and the license should be issued as the applicant met all statutory requirements necessary to hold a Club Liquor License in the state of New Jersey.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED, by the Township Council of the Township of Lower, County of Cape May, State of New Jersey, the Municipal Issuing Authority, as follows:


1. The submitted renewal application form is complete in all respects and complies with the requirements of N.J.A.C. 13:2-8.7.

2. The officers and directors of applicant club are qualified to be licensed according to all standards established by Title 33 of the New Jersey statutes, regulations promulgated thereunder as well as pertinent local ordinances or conditions consistent with Title 33;
3. The club maintains all records required pursuant to N.J.A.C. 13:2-8.7 and 8.8;
4. The officers and directors of the applicant club have certified, on a form prescribed by the Director, that they have read and understand all their legal responsibilities pertaining to the operation of a club license.

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that Club Liquor License #0505-31-024-001 be renewed and issued to the person, firms and/or corporations named on the above license for the period of one (1) year, commencing July 1, 2024 through June 30, 2025.



ORDINANCE #2024-15

Title: **AN ORDINANCE AMENDING CHAPTER 90, POLICE DEPARTMENT, ARTICLE III, OFF-DUTY POLICE SERVICES, IN ORDER TO MODIFY COMPENSATION RATES FROM PRIVATE PERSONS AND ENTITIES FOR EXTRA-DUTY DETAILS FOR POLICE-RELATED MATTERS**

WHEREAS, Chapter 90, Article III, subsection 20, of the municipal code of the Township of Lower establishes compensation rates for patrol officers, sergeants, and superior officers performing extra-duty details for police-related matters for private or public entities; and

WHEREAS, on October 7, 2024, the Township Council of the Township of Lower adopted Resolutions 2024-334 and 2024-335 ratifying four (4) year Memorandums of Agreement with the Lower Township Policemen's Benevolent Association (PBA) Local 59 and the Lower Township Superior Officers Association which included a provision increasing the rate of compensation for police officers working "extra duty" assignments to a rate of \$85.00 per hour; and

WHEREAS, the Township Council of the Township of Lower finds it to be necessary and appropriate to revise §90-20(A) of the Code of the Township of Lower to reflect the increase in compensation rates for extra-duty assignments from \$60.00 per hour to \$85.00 per hour, consistent with the above referenced Memorandums of Agreement;

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT ORDAINED AND ENACTED by the Township Council of the Township of Lower, County of Cape May, State of New Jersey that Chapter 90, Police Department, Article III, Off-Duty Police Services, Subsection 20(A), Terms and conditions for performance of extra-duty details, of the Code of the Township of Lower, be and hereby is amended as follows:

Section 1. Chapter 90, Article III, Off-Duty Police Services, Subsection 20(A), is hereby amended as follows:

90-20 Terms and conditions for performance of extra-duty details.

- (A) The compensation from the private persons or entities to the Township of Lower police officers shall be fixed at \$85.00 per hour. In addition, the private person or entity shall also pay the Township of Lower the sum of \$5 per hour worked by each Lower Township police officer to offset the cost of administration. For the use of Lower Township Police Department vehicles, the private person or entity shall pay the Township of Lower the sum of \$50 per day (or fraction thereof), which fee may be waived when vehicles are used by other public entities.

Section 2. All other ordinances in conflict or inconsistent with this Ordinance are hereby repealed to the extent of such conflict or inconsistency.

Section 3. Should any section, paragraph, sentence, clause or phrase of this Ordinance be declared unconstitutional or invalid for any reason, the remaining portions of this Ordinance shall not be affected thereby and shall remain in full force and effect, and to this end the provision of this Ordinance are hereby declared to be severable.

Section 4. This Ordinance shall become effective 20 days after final passage and publication according to law.

RESOLUTION #2024-341

Title: **A RESOLUTION PROVIDING FOR A MEETING NOT OPEN TO THE PUBLIC IN ACCORDANCE WITH THE PROVISIONS OF THE NEW JERSEY OPEN PUBLIC MEETINGS ACT, N.J.S.A. 10:4-12**

WHEREAS, the Township Council of the Township of Lower is subject to certain requirements of the Open Public Meetings Act, N.J.S.A 10:4-6, et seq.; and

WHEREAS, the Open Public Meetings Act, N.J.S.A. 10:4-12, provides that an Executive Session, not open to the public, may be held for certain specified purposes when authorized by Resolution; and

WHEREAS, it is necessary for the Township Council of the Township of Lower to discuss in a session not open to the public certain matters relating to the item or items authorized by N.J.S.A. 10:4-12b and designated below:

____(1) **Matters Required by Law to be Confidential:** Any matter which, by express provision of Federal law or State statute or rule of court shall be rendered confidential or excluded from the provisions of the Open Public Meetings Act.

____(2) **Matters Where the Release of Information Would Impair the Right to Receive Funds:** Any matter in which the release of information would impair a right to receive funds from the Government of the United States.

____(3) **Matters Involving Individual Privacy:** Any material the disclosure of which constitutes an unwarranted invasion of individual privacy such as any records, data, reports, recommendations, or other personal material of any educational, training, social service, medical, health, custodial, child protection, rehabilitation, legal defense, welfare, housing, relocation, insurance and similar program or institution operated by a public body pertaining to any specific individual admitted to or served by such institution or program, including but not limited to information, relative to the individual's personal and family circumstances, and any material pertaining to admission, discharge, treatment, progress or condition of any individual, unless the individual concerned (or, in the case of a minor or incompetent, his guardian) shall request in writing that the same be disclosed publicly.

X (4) **Matters Relating to Collective Bargaining Agreement:** Any collective bargaining agreement, or the terms and conditions which are proposed for inclusion in any collective bargaining agreement, including the negotiation of the terms and conditions thereof with employees or representatives of employees of the public body.

____(5) **Matters Relating to the Purchase, Lease or Acquisition of Real Property or the Investment of Public Funds:** Any matter involving the purchase, lease or acquisition of real property with public funds, the setting of banking rates or investment of public funds, where it could adversely affect the public interest if discussion of such matters were disclosed.

____(6) **Matters relating to Public Safety and Property:** Any tactics and techniques utilized in protecting the safety and property of the public, provided that their disclosure could impair such protection. Any investigations of violations or possible violations of the law.

X (7) **Matters Relating to Litigation, Negotiations and the Attorney-Client Privilege:** any pending or anticipated litigation or contract negotiation in which the public body is, or may become a party. Any matters falling within the attorney-client privilege, to the extent that confidentiality is required in order for the attorney to exercise his ethical duties as a lawyer. **Attorney/Client Privilege**

____(8) **Matters Relating to the Employment Relationship:** Any matter involving the employment, appointment, termination of employment, terms and conditions of employment, evaluation of the performance or disciplining of any specific prospective public officer or employee or current public officer or employee employed or appointed by the public body, unless all the individual employees or appointees whose rights could be adversely affected request in writing that such matter or matters be discussed at a public meeting.

____(9) **Matters Relating to the Potential Imposition of a Penalty:** Any deliberations of a public body occurring after a public hearing that may result in the imposition of a specific civil penalty upon the responding party or the suspension or loss if a license or permit belonging to the responding party bears responsibility.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED by the Township Council of the Township of Lower, assembled in public session on October 21, 2024 that an Executive Session closed to the public shall be held on this date at approximately 5:30 p.m. in the Conference Room of the Township Hall, 2600 Bayshore Road, Villas for the discussion of matters relating to the specific items designated above.

It is anticipated that the deliberations conducted in closed session may be disclosed to the public upon the determination of the Township Council that the public interest will no longer be served by such confidentiality.
