Pursuant to the above referenced Subsection 400-81E, Resolution #2025-183, is required to release the Performance Guarantee held in trust by the Township of Lower for 115 Breakwater Road Major Subdivision. The required final inspection report, certifying completion, compliance, and condition of the work, has been received from the Acting Township Engineer, Mott McDonald.

The Township Engineer recommends release of the Retained \$304,284.00.

The inspection and construction costs of the bonded improvements have been paid for by the developer. All mandated improvements must be completed for the project's final approval.

The Land Development Ordinance of the Township of Lower requires that a Maintenance Guarantee, in an amount equal to not more than fifteen percent (15%) of the original estimate of the cost of improvements, shall be filed by the owner. Therefore, \$53,734.20, which is fifteen percent, shall be retained as the Maintenance Guarantee.

Beginning at the northerly curb line of Strawberry Lane and extending 105 feet northerly therefrom (location 16537).

- 2. In accordance with the provisions of N.J.S.A. 39:4-8(e), the Township Council of the Township of Lower requests that the following locations located along Seashore Road (CR 626) be eliminated as bus stops:
  - A. Along Seashore Road (CR 626), northbound, on the easterly side thereof at:
    - i. Farmstead Avenue (Near side)

### **Terms and Conditions**

This agreement is made and entered into this day, by and between the New Jersey Council for the Humanities ("NJCH") and the Lower Township Historic Preservation Commission ("Participant Organization").

The Participant Organization shall be directly responsible for participation in this program and the administration of the project created therein.

The term of this agreement shall be a period starting from the date signed until December 31, 2025, or until terminated by either party. The conditions of the agreement apply during this term. This agreement may be supplemented, amended, or modified only by the mutual agreement of the parties and shall not be binding unless it is in writing and signed by all parties. Only the Executive Director of NJCH or an individual authorized by the Executive Director is authorized to modify any of the terms of

this award on behalf of NJCH. NJCH shall not be liable for any costs incurred by the participant which do not conform with the terms of the agreement.

This agreement contains the entire agreement between the parties and supersedes all prior written or oral discussions or agreements.

### 1. Program Description

Community History participants work closely with their communities to learn about, engage with, and share untold and under-represented stories from those communities. Participants receive instruction on public history practices, develop projects in a cohort environment that encourages collaboration, and receive funding from NJCH to launch projects in their communities. Changes to participants selected to represent Participant Organization in the program must be requested and approved in writing before transferring substantive project work to new personnel.

### 2. Participation

The Participant Organization agrees to identify one (1) to three (3) representatives to attend all scheduled learning sessions. Should a representative be unable to attend a specific session, an alternate person from the project team may serve as a substitute. Participant Organization is required to notify NJCH immediately of any changes to the project team or primary contact person for the organization.

### 3. Timeline

Program activities will take place between February and December 2025, including two daylong workshops in February, and 2-hour sessions in the following months that will take place virtually. A full schedule of dates will be confirmed at the start of the program. NJCH will make every effort to accommodate the schedule of participants and expects Participant Organizations to be flexible in return.

Additional one-on-one meetings (virtual) for each Participant Organization will be scheduled throughout the program at times mutually agreeable to all involved.

Any changes to this schedule will be confirmed in writing to the Participant Organization. Changes will take into account the availability of all program participants to the fullest extent possible.

### 4. Participant Organization Responsibilities

The Participant Organization agrees:

- To attend all scheduled learning sessions.
- To complete all work assigned throughout the program.
- To work with representative members of the broader community to develop a history-focused project in the course of the program. The final project plan and budget must be submitted to NJCH as part of the regular work of this program.
- To participate in program evaluation.
- To submit a final project plan and budget as a culminating assignment for the program. A
  separate award agreement will be instituted to additional award and scope of work for the
  project, should the Participant Organization and NJCH mutually agree to continue.

### 5. Use of Funds and Payment Schedule

The Participant Organization will receive an award of \$1000 for participation in Community History. This award will be released to each participant organization after receipt of this signed agreement and attendance by the Participant Organization at the first workshop. Participant Organizations will be

eligible to receive up to \$5000 in additional funding to implement the project they develop in the course of the program. Information about how this funding is awarded and the schedule of payment will be released during the Community History program.

### 6. Funding Restrictions and Ineligible Costs

Details on how NJCH funds can be used to support projects will be part of the course work. The following costs are ineligible on all NJCH-funded work:

- Work outside of the humanities, including the creation or performance of art; creative writing, autobiographies, memoirs, creative nonfiction; and empirically based social science research or policy studies.
- Direct social action or political advocacy, including the advocacy of a program of social or political action, support of specific public policies or legislation, and lobbying.
- Re-grants, prizes, awards, projects that provide academic credit, scholarships, fellowships, or regular course offerings.
- The purchase of land or facilities, capital projects, construction, renovation.
- Acquisitions of major equipment.
- Alcohol and entertainment.
- Fundraising activities, contributions to an endowment, and repayment of loans or debts.
- Overlapping project costs with any other pending or approved NJCH funding.

### 7. Non-compliance and Termination of Award

If NJCH determines that the Participant Organization has failed to comply with the terms and conditions of this agreement, NJCH may terminate the agreement for cause. An award may also be terminated by mutual consent of NJCH and the Participant Organization or at the Participant Organization's request. If your award is terminated by NJCH:

- a. Participant Organization will be provided with written notice of termination and will be consulted about the intended termination by NJCH. This termination will not affect any commitments made prior to the date of termination. If there is disagreement as to when these commitments were made, the judgment of NJCH will prevail.
- b. Participant Organization must furnish NJCH with an itemized accounting of funds spent, owed, and left over in your award within 60 days of the termination date.
- c. Participant Organization must return any money that is left over from your award to NJCH within 30 days of termination.

### 8. Acknowledgment

The Participant Organization agrees to acknowledge this program using the following language or a reasonable equivalent:

### 9. Indemnification

As part of the terms of this agreement, the Participant Organization agrees to hold NJCH, the National Endowment for the Humanities, and its employees and agents harmless. The Participant Organization also agrees to defend and indemnify NJCH, the National Endowment for the Humanities, and its employees and agents against all claims, actions, liability, damage, loss, and expense, including attorney

fees, in any matter arising (or alleged to have arisen) from acts or omission by the Participant Organization and its employees, agents, and sub-contractors in connection with the program. The Participant Organization is required to maintain general liability insurance appropriate for the program and the project created therein.

State or federal agencies that are not permitted to indemnify outside organizations or their employees should attach a statement to that effect as an amendment to the agreement.

To protect your interests, NJCH strongly recommends that you develop written agreements whenever services or goods are to be provided to you by others.

### 10. Intellectual Property

The Participant Organization agrees that all intellectual property, whether copyrighted or not, including but not limited to any script(s), production material, and related print, audio, visual, or digital materials produced under this agreement ("Products"), shall be subject to the terms and conditions of this section and the other terms hereof. The Participant Organization assumes full responsibility for said conditions and for apprising other funders and project personnel of these terms and conditions.

- a. If the Participant Organization uses any materials copyrighted by others in connection with the project, the Participant Organization shall possess the necessary rights required to use such copyrighted materials.
- b. The Participant Organization may copyright any Products that are developed or acquired in connection with the program. The title to Products developed under this agreement shall remain solely with the Participant Organization, unless a transfer of ownership rights is approved in writing by NJCH.
- c. NJCH and NEH hereby reserve, and Participant Organization hereby grants to NJCH and NEH, a royalty-free, nonexclusive, and irrevocable right to reproduce, publish, or otherwise use for NJCH or NEH purposes any Products created or acquired by the Participant Organization in accordance with this agreement.
- d. The Participant Organization agrees to request from any other person owning a copyright on all or any part of the Product a release stating that NJCH and NEH may use or reproduce, without payment, such person's contribution to the Product.
- e. The Participant Organization agrees to furnish to NJCH, at the Participant Organization's cost, one (1) copy of all Products created through the program at its conclusion.
- f. Products must be offered for distribution to broad public audiences in keeping with NJCH's goal that the New Jersey public have ready and easy access to NJCH award products. All distribution arrangements, including agreements for distributing content across digital platforms, must be submitted to NJCH for review prior to the Participant Organization's signing an agreement. NJCH requires at least fifteen business days for review of distribution agreements. This condition extends to all forms of distribution as well as any plans for modification, repackaging, or repurposing of the production elements. Once distribution agreements are finalized, the Participant Organization shall keep NJCH informed about the outcome of distribution efforts.
- g. During the agreement period, the Participant Organization may use earned income from the distribution of Products to offset its share of the project costs. After the agreement period, the Participant Organization may use earned income in any way it chooses.

### 11. Doing Business with Debarred and Suspended Parties

Participant Organization is prohibited from doing business with any organization or person if they have been debarred or suspended by any Federal department or agency. The OMB Guidelines to Agencies on

Government-wide Debarment and Suspension (Non-procurement) contained in 2 CFR part 180 and the National Endowment for the Humanities regulations contained in 2 CFR part 3369 apply to this award. The Participant Organization is required to ensure compliance by checking the Exclusions area within the Performance Information functional area of SAM.gov (formerly the Excluded Parties List System or EPLS) and complying with Subpart C of these regulations. The Participant Organization is responsible for further requiring the inclusion of a similar term or condition in any subsequent lower tier covered transaction.

### 12. Federal Award Identification

a. Accounting Records. Participant Organization must maintain records that adequately identify the source and application of funds provided for financially assisted activities. These records must contain information pertaining to obligations, unobligated balances, assets, liabilities, expenditures, and income.

Participant Organization shall have a double entry accounting system that is maintained according to generally accepted accounting principles that are applied on a consistent basis. The system should provide for a general ledger, a cash receipts journal, a cash disbursements journal, and a general journal.

- b. Internal Control. Effective control and accountability must be maintained for all cash, real and personal property, and other assets. Participant Organization must adequately safeguard all such property and must provide assurance that it is used solely for authorized purposes.
- c. Allowable Costs. 2 CFR §200, Subpart E Cost Principles, the General Terms and Conditions for General Support Grants to State Humanities Councils, and the terms and conditions of this award will be followed in determining the reasonableness, allowability, and allocability of costs.
- d. Source Documentation. Accounting records must be supported by such source documentation as canceled checks, bank statements, invoices, paid bills, donor letters, time and attendance records, activity reports, travel reports, contractual and consultant agreements, and subaward documentation. All supporting documentation should be clearly identified with the award identification number and name of the general ledger accounts that are to be charged or credited.

Formal agreements with independent contractors, such as consultants, must include a description of the services to be performed, the period of performance, the fee and method of payment, an itemization of travel and other costs that are chargeable to the agreement.

### 2. Interest Earned on Advances (2 CFR §200.305)

Recipients of National Endowment for the Humanities funds are required to maintain advances of Federal funds in interest bearing accounts unless they receive less than \$120,000 in Federal awards during their fiscal year. In accordance with Public Law 111-88 Sec. 427, none of the funds made available under this award may be distributed to the Association of Community Organizations for Reform Now (ACORN) or its subsidiaries.

### 4. Fundraising

Fundraising costs may not be charged as expenditures under this award.

### 5. Lobbying Activities (2 CFR §200.450)

Grant Recipient is prohibited by The Byrd Anti-Lobbying Amendment (31 U.S.C. 1352), "Limitation on use of appropriated funds to influence certain Federal contracting and financial transactions," from using appropriated National Endowment for the Humanities funds to pay any person for influencing or attempting to influence any officer or employee of an agency, a member of Congress, an officer or employee of Congress, or an employee of a member of Congress with respect to the award, extension, continuation, renewal, amendment, or modification of any of these instruments. While non-Federal funds may be used for such activities, they may not be included in your budget, and their use must be disclosed to NJCH.

These requirements are implemented by the National Endowment for the Humanities in 45 CFR part 1168. Also see 2 CFR §200.450 Lobbying, that provides additional information regarding the lobbying

prohibitions and describes types of activities, such as legislative liaison activities and professional and technical services that are not subject to this prohibition. Therefore, any costs associated with lobbying activities must be recorded separately in Participant Organization's books to ensure that they are not charged to this grant.

### 6. Procurement Standards (2 CFR §§200.317 - 326)

The standards contained in this section do not relieve the Grant Recipient of the responsibilities arising under its contracts. The Grant Recipient is the responsible authority, without recourse to NJCH or the National Endowment for the Humanities, regarding the settlement and satisfaction of all contractual and administrative issues arising out of procurements entered into in support of an award or other agreement. Matters concerning the violation of a statute are to be referred to such Federal, state, or local authority as may have proper jurisdiction.

### 7. Audit Requirements

NJCH may inspect or audit Participant Organization's financial accounts and records or may assign a qualified person to do so. Inspection and audit may include visits to the grantee before grant payments are made to make sure that the Participant Organization's accounting system is adequate. The National Endowment for the Humanities may also conduct an inspection or audit. The Federal Government has the right to audit third party accounts related to the grants. Participant Organization shall have audits performed that meet the requirements of the Single Audit Act Amendments of 1996 (31 USC 7501-7507) as implemented by 2 CFR 200, Subpart F - Audit Requirements. Award recipients that expend more than \$750,000 in Federal funds from all sources during their fiscal year are subject to the Single Audit (formerly known as the A-133 audit).

This grant provided by NJCH is a re-grant of money received from the National Endowment for the Humanities, a Federal agency. This means that the funds awarded through this grant are Federal funds (45.129 Promotion of the Humanities\_Federal-State Partnership) and that grantees must comply with any Federal, state, or local laws, rules, or regulations that may pertain.

### 8. Misapplied Funds

If NJCH determines that Participant Organization misapplied any of your funds, NJCH has an ownership interest in any money or property acquired through the use of the misapplied funds. You must also repay misapplied funds to NJCH.

### 9. Uncommitted Funds

If Participant Organization has funds left over at the end of the program period designated by this agreement that have not been committed for budgeted goods or services, Participant Organization must return these funds to NJCH.

### 10. Record Retention (2 CFR §§200.333 – 335)

Financial records, supporting documentation, statistical records, and all other records pertinent to the award shall be retained by the Participant Organization for three years following submission of their final report to NJCH. Records for real property and equipment acquired with the National Endowment for the Humanities funds must be retained for three years after final disposition.

If the three-year retention period is extended because of audits, appeals, litigation, or the settlement of claims arising out of performance, the records shall be retained by the award recipient until such audits, appeals, litigation, or claims are resolved.

NJCH, the National Endowment for the Humanities, the Comptroller General of the United States, and any of their duly authorized representatives shall have access to any pertinent books, documents, papers, and records of the Participant Organization to make audits, examinations, excerpts, transcripts, and copies. See 2 CFR §§200.336 – 337 for additional information.

### 1. Civil Rights and Non-Discrimination

Title VI of the Civil Rights Act of 1964, as amended, provides that no person in the United States shall, on the grounds of race, color, or national origin, be excluded from participation in, be denied the benefits of, or be subject to discrimination under any program or activity receiving Federal financial assistance. (42 U.S.C. 2000d et seq.) Title VI also extends protection to persons with limited English proficiency. Please note that the National Endowment for the Humanities has issued policy guidance for recipients on "Title VI Prohibition Against National Origin Discrimination As It Affects Persons With Limited English Proficiency."

Title IX of the Education Amendments of 1972 provides that no person in the United States shall, on the basis of sex, be excluded from participation in, be denied benefits of, or be subject to discrimination under any education program or activity receiving Federal financial assistance. ### 2. Labor Standards Assurances - Employment of Professional Performers

Dear Mr. Douglass:

On April 29, 2025, the New Jersey Department of Transportation's (NJDOT) notified all municipalities that applications are being accepted for the FY2026 State Ald programs. The NJDOT is accepting applications for four (4) categories and a brief description of each category is listed below:

- Municipal Aid This \$150 million program has been a significant resource in funding local transportation projects. All municipalities are eligible. The Department continues to encourage municipalities to consider using the Municipal Aid Program to fund projects that support walking and biking in their communities especially now that additional funds are available. NJDOT has set a goal to award up to 10% of the Municipal Aid Program funds to projects such as pedestrian safety Improvements, bikeways and streetscapes. An additional \$10 million is provided in Urban Aid for a total of \$150 million.
- Transit Village This program will award grants totaling \$1 million for traditional and non-traditional transportation projects that enhance walking, biking and/or transit rider ship within ½ mile of the transit facility. Only New Jersey municipalities that have been designated as Transit Villages by the Commissioner of Transportation and the inter-agency Transit Village Task force are eligible to apply.
- Bikeways This \$1 million program is intended to fund bicycle projects which create new Bike
  Path Mileage. It is available to all counties and municipalities. The Department continues to work
  toward the goal of achieving 1,000 miles of dedicated bikeways in New Jersey. Special
  consideration will be given to bikeways that are physically separated from motorized vehicular
  traffic by an open space or barrier, but on-road bike lanes and other bike routes and facilities are
  also eligible for funding.

Safe Streets to Transit – The Intent of this program is to encourage counties and municipalities to
construct safe and accessible pedestrian linkages to transit facilities, in order to promote
increased usage of transit by all segments of the population. A total of \$1 million is available for
grant awards.

Our fee to prepare and submit the Township's State Aid application(s) is \$2,500.00 for one application and \$1,000.00 for each additional application thereafter.

The applications must be completed and submitted on or before July 1, 2025 on-line thru SAGE. Since the applications must be authorized for submission by an approved resolution of the Township, we are requesting that the Township select the project candidate(s) as soon as possible so that we can meet the application deadline.

### **ORDINANCE #2025-13**

Title: AN ORDINANCE AMENDING CHAPTER 400, LAND DEVELOPMENT, OF THE CODE OF THE TOWNSHIP OF LOWER TO REFLECT AMENDMENTS TO THE CANNABIS REGULATORY, ENFORCEMENT, ASSISTANCE, AND MARKETPLACE MODERNIZATION ACT AUTHORIZING CLASS 5 RETAIL LICENSEES TO PROVIDE DELIVERY SERVICES

WHEREAS, on February 22, 2021, New Jersey Governor Philip Murphy signed the 'New Jersey Cannabis Regulatory, Enforcement Assistance, and Marketplace Modernization Act' (the "Act"), N.J.S.A. 24:6I-1 et seq., into law, thereby effectively legalizing marijuana throughout the state of New Jersey; and

WHEREAS, the Act legalized the recreational use of marijuana and established a comprehensive regulatory and licensing scheme for the creation of a commercial cannabis industry within the state of New Jersey and specifically created six (6) distinct classes of commercial cannabis licenses related to growing, processing, distributing, wholesale, delivery, and retail uses; and

WHEREAS, the Act expressly authorized Municipalities the right to prohibit and/or permit the operation of any one or more classes of cannabis licenses, with the exception of the right of an outside delivery service to deliver cannabis within the jurisdiction of the municipality by way of the enactment of an Ordinance within one hundred and eighty (180) days of the enactment of the Act; and

WHEREAS, on July 6, 2021, Township Council adopted Ordinance #2021-13 which amended Chapter 400, Land Development, of the Code of the Township of Lower and authorized the issuance of no more than two (2) Class 5 Cannabis Retail Licenses and no more than two (2) Class 6 Cannabis Delivery Licenses in the GB-1 and I zoning districts; and

WHEREAS, on November 15, 2021, Township Council adopted Ordinance #2021-20 which further amended Chapter 400, Land Development, of the Code of the Township of Lower and authorized Class 5 Cannabis Retail Licenses and Class 6 Cannabis Delivery Licenses to be located within the MD-2 zoning district; and

WHEREAS, on February 22, 2023, the New Jersey Cannabis Regulatory Commission amended its rules to allow Class 5 Cannabis Retailers to deliver cannabis directly to consumers without the need for a separate Class 6 Cannabis Delivery Service license, and, in an effort to ensure consistency with the Act, the Township Council of the Township of Lower finds it necessary to amend Chapter 400, Land Development, of the Township Code to incorporate this amendment:

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT ORDAINED AND ENACTED by the Township Council of the Township of Lower, County of Cape May, State of New Jersey that Chapter 400, Land Development, of the Code of the Township of Lower, be and hereby is amended as follows:

<u>Section 1</u>. The following subsections of **Chapter 400**, **Land Development**, are hereby added and/or amended as follows:

### § 400-17 Definitions.

### **CANNABIS DELIVERY SERVICE**

Any licensed person or entity that provides courier services for consumer purchases of cannabis items and related supplies fulfilled by a cannabis retailer in order to make deliveries of the cannabis items and related supplies to that consumer, and which services include the ability of a consumer to purchase the cannabis items directly through the cannabis delivery service, which, after presenting the purchase order to the cannabis retailer for fulfillment, is delivered to that consumer. Cannabis Delivery Services shall hold either a Class 5 Cannabis Retail License and maintain required approvals and authorizations outlined within N.J.A.C. 17:30-14.8 and N.J.S.A. 24:6I-44, or a Class 6 Cannabis Delivery license.

### **CANNABIS RETAILER**

Any licensed person or entity that purchases or otherwise obtains usable cannabis from cannabis cultivators and cannabis items from cannabis manufacturers or cannabis wholesalers, and sells these to consumers from a retail store, and may use a cannabis delivery service or a certified cannabis handler for the off-premises delivery of cannabis items and related supplies to consumers. This person or entity shall hold a Class 5 cannabis retail license. The Holder of a Class 5 cannabis retail license shall also be permitted to provide delivery services subject to the provisions of N.J.A.C. 17:30-14.8 and N.J.S.A. 24:61-44.

### § 400-56 Conditional Uses.

- P. Class 5 Cannabis Retail Stores
  - (14) The holder of a Class 5 Cannabis Retail License shall be permitted to deliver cannabis products to their consumers pursuant to the requirements of N.J.A.C. 17:30-14.8 and N.J.S.A. 24:61-44, and subject to obtaining the necessary authorizations and approvals from the Cannabis Regulatory Commission.

### § 400-111 GB-1 Cannabis Overlay Zone.

- E. Additional Requirements.
  - (10) The holder of a Class 5 Cannabis Retail License shall be permitted to deliver cannabis products to their consumers pursuant to the requirements of N.J.A.C. 17:30-14.8 and N.J.S.A. 24:61-44, and subject to obtaining the necessary authorizations and approvals from the Cannabis Regulatory Commission.
- <u>Section 2</u>. All other ordinances in conflict or inconsistent with this Ordinance are hereby repealed to the extent of such conflict or inconsistency.

<u>Section 3</u>. Should any section, paragraph, sentence, clause or phrase of this Ordinance be declared unconstitutional or invalid for any reason, the remaining portions of this Ordinance shall not be affected thereby and shall remain in full force and effect, and to this end the provisions of this Ordinance are hereby declared to be severable.

Section 4. This Ordinance shall become effective 20 days after final passage and publication according to law.

### Lower Township Recreation Aids - Local #3779B, AFSCME NJ, AFL-CIO MEMORANDUM OF AGREEMENT

This Memorandum of Agreement (MOA) is made this 36 day of April between the Township of Lower (the Township) and Lower Township Recreation Aids - Local #3779B, AFSCME NJ, AFL-CIO (AFSCME or Union).

The Township and AFSCME have engaged in collective bargaining negotiations regarding a new Collective Bargaining Agreement (CBA) to replace the existing CBA between the parties, which expired on December 31, 2024.

The Township of Lower and AFSCME have reached a tentative agreement of the terms and conditions of a new CBA and purpose of this MOA is to confirm that agreement.

Said tentative agreement and this MOA will not be effective until ratified by the membership of AFSCME and the governing body of the Township

NOW, THEREFORE, the Township and AFSCME agree that the following changes shall be made in the existing agreement.

- 1. Retroactivity the agreement shall be retroactive to January 1, 2025.
- 2. Preamble-4-year term.
- 3. Article III. Agency Shop. The following shall replace the existing language:
  - A. The Union shall provide the Township appropriate signature cards from represented employees authorizing dues deductions and shall notify the Township promptly of any change in status.
  - B. Dues deducted by the Township shall be transmitted to the designated Union official of the American Federation of State, County, and Municipal Employees, New Jersey Council 63, AFL-CIO. The Township agrees to provide the Union, on a quarterly basis, a complete up-to-date electronic listing of all employees covered by this Contract. Such listing shall be in the Excel format and include the employee's department, job classification, work location, home address, employment status, membership status and the amount of dues deducted as it appears on the records of the Township. For the purpose of the deduction of dues for titles covered by this Agreement; Any member working 40 or fewer, but more than 20 hours per week shall be considered a full-time member, any member working 20 or fewer,





but more than 12 hours per week shall be considered a lower part-time member. The Union shall provide a secure e-mail address for the receipt of the electronic listing and disclose such information only to its officials and representatives whose duties require access. The Township shall provide the Union with a list of departmental payroll codes in order to identify the Department name on the above-mentioned electronic listing.

- C. The Union shall indemnify and hold the Township harmless for any dues wrongfully deducted.
- 4. Article V. Vacations
  - No Changes
- 5. Article VII. Insurance, Health & Welfare
  - Change Health Insurance language to provide for the 20/35 Plan with a difference card.
  - Change maximum dental benefit to \$1700 a year.
- 6. Article VIII. Leaves of Absence.
  - Replace Paragraph B as follows: "Family/Medical leaves of absence will be granted in Accordance with the Federal Family & Medical Leave Act ("FMLA") and the New Jersey Family Leave Act ("NJFLA") and the regulations promulgated thereunder. Leaves may be extended, upon good cause shown, for up to six (6) additional months. Other leaves of absence may be granted in the sole discretion of the Township Manager and shall not be paid for a period in excess of six (6) months.
- 7. Article XI. Sick Leave & Retirement
  - Add "as" before "defined" in second sentence of Paragraph C.
- 8. Article XIII. Wages
  - A 3.5% yearly wage increase as of 1/1/2025, 1/1/2026, 1/1/2027, 1/1/2028.
  - An additional \$1.00/hr. raise as of 1/1/2025 for the following employees:
    - 1. Rocco Sansone
    - 2. Gloria Lugo
    - 3. Matthew Schelling
  - Move starting rate up to reflect current minimum wage in Paragraph C.
  - Change "two (2) hours regular pay" to "three (3) hours regular pay" for minimum call-in.



- 9. Article XIV. Longevity
  - Remove entire Article.
- 10. Article XVI. General Provisions
  - Delete the word "other" in Paragraph F.
  - Change five (5) to three (3)
- 11. Adjust all dates to reflect the current four (4) year contract.

This MOA is subject to the ratification of the members of AFSCME and approval of the governing body of the Township. The bargaining members of AFSCME and of the Township represent that they will recommend approval of the terms to their respective constituents.
