COUNCIL MEETING MINUTES - August 4, 2025

The meeting of the Township Council of the Township of Lower, County of Cape May, State of New Jersey was held on August 4, 2025 at 5:00 p.m. in the meeting room of the Township Hall, 2600 Bayshore Road, Villas, New Jersey.

The Clerk announced that the meeting was being held in compliance with the Open Public Meetings Act and that adequate notice of the meeting had been provided according to law.

Work Session

<u>Public Hearing</u> – Adoption of Bidder Pre-Qualification Regulations in connection with Phase II Improvements to the Judge Nathaniel Foster House located at 1649 Bayshore Road Mayor Sippel announced the following:

The Township recently completed Phase 1 of renovations to the historic Judge Nathaniel Foster House. Phase 1 work included a new wood shingle roof, structural reinforcement of the wooden frame, removal of asbestos siding and repairs to the underlying clapboard, installation of a new electrical panel, and rewiring of the first floor. We are now preparing to go out to bid for Phase 2, which will improve public access to the building. Planned work includes ADA upgrades, reconstruction of deteriorated chimneystacks, replacement of missing and damaged window shutters, preservation of the historic fireback in the first-floor parlor, rewiring of the second floor, replacement of stairs, landings, and railings, renovation of the side porch, and stabilization of accessory buildings.

In an effort to ensure the preservation of the historic the Judge Nathaniel Foster House, the Township has elected to establish prequalification requirements for prospective bidders. The qualifications are intended to ensure that prospective contractors have the financial stability, experience, and equipment necessary to carry out the work.

Tonight's public hearing is an opportunity for the public and interested bidders to comment on these proposed requirements. A notice of this hearing was properly published in the Cape May Star and Wave on July 2, 2025, and the Press of Atlantic City on July 3, 2025. We welcome your input before the Township considers adopting the prequalification criteria.

Mayor Sippel opened the hearing up to public comment requesting anyone wishing to address Council regarding the Bidder Pre-Qualification Regulations in connection with Phase II Improvements to the Judge Nathaniel Foster House located at 1649 Bayshore Road to please step to the microphone and state your name and address for the record.

No one commented.



WHEREAS, the Screening Law provides officers and mental health specialists with the legal authority to transport or authorize transport of individuals who are experiencing a behavioral health crisis to an emergency department for a full assessment where appropriate; and

WHEREAS, law enforcement officers may request the assistance of mental health specialists when responding to emergency service calls that relate to behavioral health crises and mental health personnel may request assistance from officers when responding to requests for emergency screening; and

WHEREAS, Acenda, Inc. has been designated by the New Jersey Department of Human Services ("DHS") to provide screening services in accordance with the Screening Law and Regulations within the County of Cape May; and

WHEREAS, DHS contracts annually with Acenda, Inc. for the provision of screening services, pursuant to N.J.A.C. 10:31:10.1(c), and DHS Contracting Policy; and

WHEREAS, in April of 2023, the Lower Township Police Department and Acenda, Inc., a mental health service provider operating in the State of New Jersey, entered into a Memorandum of Understanding to jointly participate in the ARRIVE Together program, a pilot program enacted by the State of New Jersey to enhance and support law enforcement and responses to certain behavioral health crisis calls in an effort to advance the goals, directives, and objectives of the Screening Law; and

WHEREAS, in an effort to continue to improve the outcomes in law enforcement responses to emergency behavioral health crisis calls, to divert individuals in crisis from unnecessary entry into the criminal justice system, and to more efficiently employ the resources of both the Lower Township Police Department and Acenda, Inc. as they respond to calls for service together, the Parties desire to renew the terms of the current Memorandum of Understanding for an additional calendar year through June 30, 2026; and

A RESOLUTION URGING THE NEW JERSEY GOVERNOR AND LEGISLATURE TO ENACT REGULATIONS GOVERNING THE OPERATION OF ELECTRIC BICYCLES AND SCOOTERS ON PUBLIC STREETS, SIDEWALKS, BIKE PATHS, AND OTHER PUBLIC AREAS TO ENHANCE PUBLIC SAFETY

WHEREAS, pursuant to N.J.S.A. 39:4-14.16, electric bicycles and electric scooters are permitted to be operated on the streets, highways, roadways, and bicycle paths of this State; and

WHEREAS, the Township of Lower, and municipalities throughout the State of New Jersey, have experienced a marked increase in the operation of electric bicycles and scooters on public streets, sidewalks, bike paths, boardwalks, and other shared public spaces, often in close proximity to pedestrians, children, seniors, and motor vehicles; and

WHEREAS, while electric bicycles and scooters offer environmentally friendly and cost-effective modes of transportation, their rapid acceleration, higher maximum speeds, and nearly silent operation can present significant safety risks, including collisions with pedestrians and motor vehicles, loss of rider control, and a heightened risk of serious injury in connection with accidents in general; and

WHEREAS, the Lower Township Police Department, along with law enforcement agencies throughout the State, has reported difficulties in achieving consistent enforcement due to the absence of uniform statewide regulations governing the operation, minimum age limits, helmet use, insurance requirements, licensing, equipment safety, permitted areas of operation, and enforcement procedures, thereby creating inconsistent rules and potential safety risks across municipalities; and

WHEREAS, the establishment of clear, consistent, and enforceable statewide regulations would help ensure the safe and responsible operation of electric bicycles and scooters, while still promoting their use as an alternative means of transportation; and

WHEREAS, the Township Council of the Township of Lower believes that statewide legislation should, at a minimum, address:

- 1) Minimum age requirements for operation;
- Maximum allowable speeds for different classifications of electric bicycles and scooters;
- 3) Rules governing operation on sidewalks, bike lanes, and roadways;
- 4) Equipment safety standards including lights, reflectors, and braking systems:
- 5) Enforcement authority for local police departments; and
- 6) Penalties for violations to promote compliance and accountability.

WHEREAS, in order to afford the United States Army Corps of Engineers the ability to access the Cape May Canal and to enter upon the property owned by the Township, the United States Army Corps of Engineers has requested that the Township execute a Right-of-Entry Agreement, a copy of which is attached to this Resolution, with the understanding that a Temporary Work Area Easement will be requested in the near future.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED, by the Township Council of the Township of Lower, County of Cape May, State of New Jersey, that the Mayor and/or Township Manager are hereby authorized to execute the attached Right-of-Entry Agreement, together with any associated documents necessary to memorialize the United States Army Corps of Engineers' ability to enter upon Township-owned property to facilitate improvements and renovations to the Cape May Canal.

DEPARTMENT OF THE ARMY RIGHT-OF-ENTRY FOR CONSTRUCTION

Cape May Canal

Block 753.25 Lot 2-EASEMENT A,B,C,D

The undersigned, hereinafter called the "Owner," in consideration of the total compensation to be paid by the UNITED STATES OF AMERICA, hereinafter called the "Government," for all land or easement rights hereinafter described, to be determined by subsequent agreement between the Owner and the Government, or by judicial proceedings, hereby grants to the Government, a right-of-entry upon the following terms and conditions:

- 1. The Owner hereby grants to the Government its representatives, agents, and contractors an irrevocable right to enter upon the lands hereinafter described at any time within a period of Twelve (12) months from the date of this instrument, in order to facilitate access, move, store and remove equipment and supplies, and erect and remove temporary structures on the land and to perform any other work necessary and incident to the construction of the Cape May Canal Project, together with the right to trim, cut, fell and remove therefrom all trees, underbrush, obstructions, and any other vegetation, structures, or obstacles within the limits of the right-of-way.
- 2. This right-of-entry includes the right of ingress and egress on other lands of the Owner not described below, provided that such ingress and egress is necessary and not otherwise conveniently available to the Government.
- 3. All tools, equipment, buildings, improvements, and other property taken upon or placed upon the land by the Government shall remain the property of the Government and may be removed by the Government at any time within a reasonable period after the expiration of this right-of-entry.
 - 4. The Government shall have the right to patrol and police the lands hereinafter described during the period of this right-of-entry.
- 5. In the event that the Government does not acquire title or other necessary interest in said land prior to the expiration of this permit or right-of-entry, or other renewal thereof, the parties agree that, if any action of the Government's employees or agents in the exercise of this right-of-entry results in damage to the real property, the Government will, at its option, either repair such damage or make an appropriate settlement with the Owner. In no event shall such repair or settlement exceed the fair market value of the fee interest of the real property at the time immediately preceding such damage. The Government's liability under this clause may not exceed appropriations available for such payment and nothing contained in this agreement may be considered as implying that Congress will at a later date appropriate funds sufficient to meet deficiencies. The provisions of this clause are without prejudice to any rights the Owner may have to make

a claim under applicable laws for any other damages than provided herein. If the Government does acquire such title or other necessary interest, damages would be limited to the decrease in the fair market value of the owner's remainder caused by such damage.

The land affected by this right-of-entry is located in the County of Cape May, State of New Jersey, and is described as follows in Exhibit A:
